SC's urgent Sunday sitting on Maha crisis

NEW DELHI, NOV 24 (PTI): Supreme Court on Sunday asked the Centre to place before it on Monday morning the letters of Maharashtra Governor Bhagat Singh Koshyari inviting Deendra Fadnis and one of the BJP leader staking his claim to form the government in the state.

In an unprecedented hearing on a Sunday, the apex court, however, did not grant any interim relief to the Shiv Sena, NCP and Congress combine to direct the Fadnis government to undertake floor test within 24 hours and rather said that this issue would be dealt with only after perusing the two letters on Monday.

A three-judge bench headed by Justice N V Ramana said the plea of post-poll alliance, 'Maha Vilas Aghadi', seeking a direction to the governor to invite them to form government under the leadership of Shiv Sena chief Uddhav Thackeray would not be considered at present.

The bench also issued notices to the Centre, Maharashtra government, Chief Minister Deendra Fadnis and Deputy Chief Minister Ajit Pawar on the plea filed

by the combine seeking quashing of the governor's November 23 order inviting the BJP leader to form government. "As adjudication of the issues and also the interim prayers sought by the petitioners to conduct floor test within 24 hours has to be considered after perusing the governor's order as well as the letters submitted by Deendra Fadnis even though none appeared for the state government, we request Uddhav Thackeray to produce those two letters by tomorrow morning at 10.30

recommended it. Senior advocate A M Singhvi, who represented the NCP and Congress, said that the governor's decision to invite Fadnis to form the government was a "betrayal" and "annihilation of democracy" and pointed out that 41 out of 54 NCP MLAs were not with Ajit Pawar as they had already sent a signed letter that the governor clearly stating that Ajit was no more in the party and the support letter given by him to Fadnis was "illegal". Mehta opposed the

plea filed by the combine and said political parties do not have fundamental rights to form government and the petition should be dismissed on this ground alone. Senior advocate Mukul Rohatgi, appearing for some BJP and two independent MLAs, said that the governor's decision to call a political formation to form the government is part of his discretionary power under Article 361 which is immune to judicial review. "But the governor cannot just invite anybody," Justice Ramana observed.

IAF to continue agitation; warns of intensifying if state govt fails to act

KOHIAMA, NOV 24 (NPN): Joint Associations Forum (JAF) will continue with its first phase of agitation of wearing black badges by members of the respective unions at their respective offices.

Comprising Nagaland Directorate Ministerial Service Association (NDMSA), All Nagaland District Ministerial Service Association (ANDMSA), Trained Nurses Association of India-Nagaland Branch (TNAI) and Prison Service Association Nagaland (PSAN), the forum launched the protest on November 20 for non-implementation of ROP Pay Anomalies Committee (PAC) recommendation.

Speaking to Nagaland Post on the sidelines of the NDMSA biennial conference-cum-44th annual general meet here on Saturday, IAF convener M Renthun Tungeo said the forum would intensify the ongoing strike if the State government did not respond positively.

He informed this correspondent that the second phase of agitation would be in the form of mass casual leave or pen down strike, though he hoped that the government would act on the demand soon. He also hinted at a meeting with the chief secretary by next week.

Meanwhile, science & technology, information technology and new & renewable energy adviser Mmbholunmo Kikou, who attended the NDMSA biennial conference-cum-44th annual general meet as a special guest, told the members that dialogue was the way forward on any issue.

He admitted that PAC had recommended upgrade of pay levels in respect of certain category of employees and, after being examined, the government did not accept this on account that no anomalies were created by ROP Rules 2017, while upgrade as recommended would result in similar demands from similarly placed employees.

He, however, assured to play the role of a facilitator and stressed that dialogue should be the way forward, especially since they were all part of the same family.

Earlier, the forum reminded the government that the associations had submitted individual representations expressing their grievances and claims of anomalies to Anomalies Committee on being invited to do so. Accordingly, the committee in its report of May 21, 2018 had recommended higher pay level for specific employees, it pointed out.

However, the forum alleged that the government had failed to implement the recommendation for no valid and justifiable reason.

Mentioning that a joint representation was submitted to the government on September 12 this year demanding implementation of the recommendation, Joint Associations Forum regretted that there was no positive response.

The forum explained that it was forced to launch the strike after its ultimatum to the government had ended on November 14 without any response from the government.

BJP stalwart Kailash Joshi passes away

BHOPAL, NOV 24 (IANS): Kailash Joshi, one of the tallest leaders in the state and former Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister, who set a benchmark for political sagacity and probity in public life, passed away here on Sunday shortly before noon. He was 90.

Joshi was ailing for some months and was admitted to a private hospital. His death has cast a gloom in the political circles across parties in Madhya Pradesh and in Chhattisgarh, which was part of the undivided state he headed as the Chief Minister from June 1977 to January 1978. Both the states have declared a day's mourning. Joshi was a founding member of the Bharatiya Jana Sangh, the previous avatar of the BJP, in 1951. Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Union Home Minister Amit Shah, Madhya Pradesh CM Kamal Nath and Chhattisgarh CM Bhupesh Baghel condole the demise of Kailash Joshi.

Invest in research at varsities: PM to Govs

NEW DELHI, NOV 24 (PTI): Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Sunday said governors as chancellors of universities should ensure that institutions of higher learning invest in research that fosters start-up culture and leads to job creation.

The prime minister made these remarks at the concluding ceremony of the 50th annual conference of governors and lieutenant governors here.

Referring to the development of tribal areas, Modi pressed for an appropriate use of technology and adoption of progressive schemes in the sphere of sports and youth development.

He also pitched for a mission-mode focus to be given to meeting the development needs of 112 non-salting districts, particularly those falling in the tribal areas of the country, and to ensure that they come up above the state and national averages on the relevant development indices at the earliest.

A statement issued by the Prime Minister's Office said Modi told the gathering that the discussion on the appropriate use of technology and reflected the priority given by the government to water conservation and

water management techniques that were tailored to local conditions. In their role as chancellors of universities, the prime minister asked governors to inculcate the message of good habits of water conservation amongst students.

On the New Education Policy and the higher education sector, Modi highlighted the important role governors could play to ensure that universities invest in high-quality research.

He was of the view that research should harness cost effective innovations and technology that uses platforms like hackathons to foster a start-up culture and lead to job creation.

Referring to the case of living initiative, the prime minister observed that state institutions need to strike the right balance between cutting red tape and too much regulations on one hand and at the same time ensure that the primary needs related to basic sectors such as health care and education were met in an affordable manner.

On agriculture, the prime minister advocated for a focus on development of agrarian economy by following a cluster approach that offered nuanced solutions.

Security forces bust NSCN (I-M) recruitment bid in Mon district

DIMAPUR, NOV 24 (NPN): A joint team of Assam Rifles and Army personnel reportedly busted a recruitment bid that was being carried out in Mon district.

In a press note, PRO (Defence) Lt Col Sumit Sharma said the covert recruitment racket of NSCN (I-M) was busted in Mon on November 21.

PRO said, based on specific input regarding

group of youth being taken by NSCN (I-M) cadres to Aopao camp from villages under Mon district for recruitment, army and Assam Rifles pursued a bold pick-up vehicle and intercepted it at Mon-Ahoi road, foiling a major recruitment bid.

Two NSCN (I-M) cadres 'crpl' Loijah and 'sgt.' Manza were apprehended and 32 youth hailing from Laokun, Tizit Town, Jaboka, Nokzang, Hathoti

(Naginimora) and Chingpho villages were rescued, PRO added.

It was also revealed that youth from local areas had been lured by various groups on the pretext of providing jobs post Naga solution, PRO stated.

Meanwhile, the apprehendees and the innocent youth were handed over to the Mon police station on November 22 for further investigation.

30 years on: The Nagaland Liquor Total Prohibition Act

KOHIAMA, NOV 24 (NPN): With alcoholism still rife and spurious liquor flooding the State, posing a serious threat to the health of those consuming alcohol, many are now wondering whether prohibition introduced exactly 30 years ago had done Nagaland any good.

In the face of growing alcoholism and associated social evils, the church led by Nagaland Baptist Church Council (NBCC) and Naga Mothers' Association (NMA) had started a massive campaign against liquor sale in the State in the 1980s. This forced the then Congress government to pass legislation in Nagaland Legislative Assembly - Nagaland Liquor Total Prohibition (NLTP) Act, 1989 - that legalised prohibition in the State. However, 30

years down the line and with spurious liquor flooding the State due to lax implementation of the Act and young people becoming alcoholic, it is becoming increasingly clear that the Act has failed to serve its purpose.

And perhaps nothing underscores the gravity of the problem than the fact that 500 cases of alcohol and seven drugs-related cases were registered between January 2018 and August this year in the State. This was revealed to Nagaland Post by a senior excise department official.

Also, unlike the popular perception, he said most of the liquor sellers were locals, some of whom were well-connected with VIPs too. He added that many shop owners selling such spurious liquor were single mothers as they had to take care of their children. Under

the circumstances, the official explained that the excise officials usually gave warnings to such owners first and excused them because of their situations. Claiming that the excise department was doing its best to stop alcohol sale and consumption in the State, the official admitted that the situation was getting worse, adding that health and family welfare department officer remarked that Nagaland could no longer be called as a dry State as the prohibition had been a total failure. The official said the department was very concerned over consumption of spurious liquor as it often led to death.

Dr Sentu of Naga Hospital Authority, Kohima (NHAK) claimed that 99% of the liquor, which normally flowed in from the neighbouring States, was spurious. He said the problem was accentuated by the

fact that many did not have the will power to curb their drinking habits, nor bothered to do health check-ups from time to time, leading to more deaths, especially of alcoholics and druggies.

According to well-known scholar and Northfield School administrator Pehuphelic Kesizic, drinking alcohol was a moral issue, so it should not have been banned in the first place. He said NBCC dealt with moral and not legal issues, while banning was a legal issue.

Mentioning that NBCC did suggest the ban and stood by its stand, Kesizic pointed out that this was a legal issue and the State government should not put the blame on the church or any other organisation alone as it had the full authority to go about and take strong action. (Cont'd on p-7)

WB: Nagaland armed police to be withdrawn from Maoist hotbed

GUWAHATI, NOV 24 (AGENCIES): Six companies of the Nagaland Armed Police deployed in Aoyodhya hills in Purulia district of West Bengal will be withdrawn as the Naga-peace talks between the Centre and the Naga groups have reached the final stage. This has been done to keep up Nagaland's internal security.

A recent MHA order asked the West Bengal government to release the six companies as they would be re-deployed in Nagaland ahead of the signing of the Naga-peace accord.

MHA sources informed that the six companies will be head back to Nagaland by December second week. "The MHA has asked the CRPF to re-deploy in the Aoyodhya hills in consistency with the state," informed a senior MHA official.

On the other hand, the West Bengal Government has requested the MHA to reconsider its decision to withdraw the Naga troops from the Aoyodhya hills, which is known as a Maoist corridor joining Jharkhand and Odisha.

The Aoyodhya Hills was once the hotbed of Maoists and it housed a 34-member platoon of elite People's Liberation Guerrilla Army (PLGA) members - the military component of CPI (Maoists).

As a part of Indian Reserve Battalion, the Nagaland Armed Police troops were deployed in the Aoyodhya Hills in 2009. Joint operations were launched in 2009 in Junglemahal - Left Wing Extremism (LWE) areas of West Midnapore, Purulia and Bankura districts.
